IT'S SHOWTIME AGAIN

By the time you receive this newsletter you will also be receiving your Member badges and it will only be days to our 146th annual Show.

Many of you will be looking at planning your attendance and so we have included in the centre of this newsletter a guide to what's on at the Show. This is also on the website and will be reproduced in the Showguide distributed throughout Central West newspapers the week of the Show.

Much of what people have enjoyed is back again with some of the best attractions and entertainment on offer in the region. The Isuzu D-Max performance utes, Showtime FMX Moto X, Full Tilt Jousting and the best Fireworks in the region.

2014 though will be the year of greater competitive involvement with our hosting of the MARS Pet-

care PEDIGREE NSW YARD DOG CHAMPIONSHIP, a greatly increased equestrian showing and considering our dry summer a good showing of other livestock particularly Cattle.

Unfortunately one of our stalwart entertainments the Racing Pigs are unable to attend this year. The silver lining in the cloud though is that this has forced us to bring forward our plans to introduce the KIDS ARENA particularly focused on getting young people involved in the Show in fun and hopefully educational ways. We will conduct the Junior & Intermediate age groups of the Young Farmers Challenge in this Arena, together with workshops aimed at honing the 'ag' skills of future competitors (and maybe their parents), bushdancing workshops and perhaps a few other fun activities. It will also have adjacent the Teddy Bear Hospital, the Reptile display and Free Face painting. Right inside the Cottage Gate. This will be supported by OAK milk in its inaugural showing and perhaps for a long while in the future. The Open category (18-35) of the Challenge will occur in the Main Arena and the Sashings will all take place on Saturday evening.

Please be aware of our changed Traffic conditions and the Pedestrian Safety management and the need to cross the Highway at appropriate points. There will be parking set aside for members (not individually reserved) in Moore Park, you just need to display your RED parking permit.
